Please read the job titles and descriptions below. Then write in each box which of the job titles matches each description.

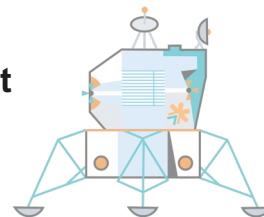
Astronaut

My job involves watching over the launch and making sure the flight goes to plan. I help everyone to communicate with each other.

I travel with the spacecraft to the moon, help to make repairs if needed and keep all the equipment working properly.

My role requires checking the software is operating properly, running tests and simulations, and debugging.

I conduct research and do experiments to help support the development of the spacecraft, and to investigate the surface of the moon.
